Failsafe Guide to Hosting a Campaign Limericks Party

Suggested Event Length: 2 hours

people: Can be run with anywhere between 3 - 300 people

Materials needed:

- Large sheets of white paper, colored markers & masking tape
- Beer and wine (if adult audience)
- Food (good fuel for poetry writing)
- Silly prizes
- Microphone (if the space is large or there are a lot of people)

First 30 minutes: Background and Setup

- People eat and drink and socialize
- Welcome everybody and introduce the facilitators
- Give the History of Limericks powerpoint presentation
- Introduce the activity: People can work in teams or alone. They will have brochures for the top Republican and Democrat candidates to use as inspirational material. They have

45 minutes to write as many limericks as they can in that time. They should write their limericks in colored marker on large sheets of white paper. When a limerick is done, they should hang it on the wall in a gallery.

• Hand out brochures for each candidate

Next 45 minutes: Write Limericks

Participants write limericks! Remind writers when there are 10 minutes left, then 5 minutes left.

Next 20 minutes: Pop-Up Limerick Gallery & Reading

Help participants tape their limericks on a wall to form an impromptu limerick gallery. If there are not too many participants, have each participant read one of the limericks that they wrote. Encourage them to speak loudly. Have a microphone if the space is large.

Next 10 minutes: Voting

Each participant gets three votes for their favorite limerick. They can't vote for their own. Have them walk around the limerick gallery and put a star next to their favorites. Voting criteria are:

- 1) Creativity and artistry
- 2) How many of the candidates' actual words did the limerick incorporate

Final 15 minutes: Prizes!

The facilitators tally the votes and award the silly prizes for each category.
















Where it all started?

The name's genealogy is generally considered to be a reference to the city or county of Limerick, Ireland, where the early nineteenth century brief songs were sung at convivial gatherings.

The origin of the name "limerick" as a poetic form is still being debated.

Sea

These verses dealt with the adventures of inhabitants of various Irish towns, and the chorus extended the invitation: "Will you come up to Limerick?"

"Will you come up to Limerick?"

The form of the verse is of the accepted pattern of the limerick, namely, three anapestic trimeter lines, and two dimeter anapests, in which the first, second, and fifth longer lines rhymed as did the two shorter third and fourth lines.

The first official Limerick

There was a young rustic named Mallory, who drew but a very small salary. When he went to the show, his purse made him go to a seat in the uppermost gallery.

The earliest known, document, use of the name "limerick" for a short, humorous lyric is an 1880 reference in a New Brunswick newspaper.

Limericks Going Way Back

It has been suggested that the limerick originated in France during the Middle Ages. An 11th century manuscript demonstrates the limerick's cadence:

> The lion is wondrous strong And full of the wiles of wo; (woe) And whether he pleye (play) Or take his preye (prey) He cannot do but slo. (slay)

The Limerick Limericks

The limerick form can be traced to the eighteenth century Gaelic poets of the Maigue, a pub in Croom, County Limerick.

Seán Ó'Tuama (1709-1775) and Aindrias MacCraith (1710-1793) were members of a group, which sometimes verbally sparred in verses employing limerick meter. For example:

> I sell the best Brandy and Sherry To make all my customers merry, But at times their finances Run short as it chances,

And then I feel very sad, very.

EDWARD LEAR

Limericks are often associated historically with Edward Lear (1818-1888), whose first published limericks appeared in *A Book of Nonsense* in 1846. His poems were not called limericks at the time, but nonsense or nursery rhymes. Lear did not claim to invent the form. It appears that during his stays at Knowsley Hall in the 1830s, he discovered a book, Anecdotes and Adventures of Fifteen Gentlemen, which contained limericks published by John Marshall in 1822.

It seems likely that these books employed a form that was already popular at the time, and that Lear liked the form and began using it himself.

Different Genres of Limericks

- bawdy limericks (the most popular kind)
- clean limericks (which proliferated in England as a Victorian and post-Victorian house-party game)
- pornographic limericks (self explained)
- sick limericks (dealing with themes of gluttony, vomit, bad and false teeth, physical deformities, cross eyes, violent death and more).

Bawdy Limerick

There was a young man of Wood Green, Who tried to fart "God Save the Queen." When he reached the soprano, He shot his guano, And his breeches were not fit to be seen.

Pornographic Limerick

A worried young man from Stamboul Discovered red spots on his tool. Said the doctor, a cynic, `Get out of my clinic! Just wipe off the lipstick, you fool.' --Gershon Legman's anthology of pornographic limericks

Clean Limerick

Crafting a Limerick:

Limericks are "closed form" poems that adhere to a strict template. Want to write your own? Follow these guidelines:

1. The last word in lines 1, 2, and 5 must rhyme and contain 8-9 syllables each.

2. The last word in lines 3 and 4 must rhyme and contain 5-6 syllables each.
